Community Supported Agriculture

A Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) is a direct-sales farming operation where the consumers and the farmers share in the benefits and risks of food production. Families or individuals support the farm by purchasing their share of the harvest at the beginning of the growing season. This enables the growers to pay the early season costs for seeds, farming supplies, labor, and living expenses that occur before the harvest begins. CSA's build community by bringing neighbors together, by putting money into the local economy, and by promoting local food security, safe farming practices and a lower carbon footprint. CSA's create productive and profitable small farms, and provide consumers with the freshest most **alive** foods available.

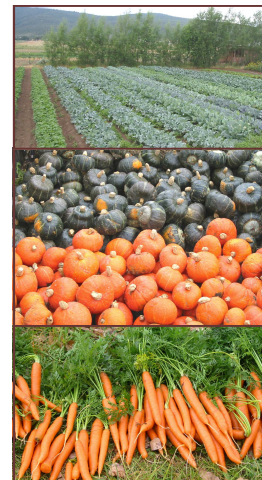


How we grow:

We use drip and sprinkler irrigation to water our row-crops, and use alfalfa compost, and New Mexico humates as our main fertilizers. All of our farm inputs are approved by the National Organic Program. Our plow-down of winter cover crops and summer green-manure crops builds healthy living soil, which in turn grows vibrant, nutrient-dense food crops.
